

How and Why We Serve

Founded in 1867 and led by courageous Free Methodist Women who dared to minister where most would not go, Olive Branch Mission is not only the oldest rescue mission in the City of Chicago; it is the Nation's oldest and longest running rescuemission.

Historical records recount their travels through Chicago's streets and alleyways at

all hours of the day and night, during the worst of weather to care for the hungry, homeless, sick and dying. These dedicated Mission women regularly ministered in Cook County Jail and Cook County Hospital. They fought their social battles upon Christian principles and challenged common social ills.

While the initial motivation to start Olive Branch Mission was to provide women an alternative source of income in response to prostitution and an immediate and urgent and growing crisis of the enslavement of young girls to sex trafficking, it wasn't long before the ministry grew to include support of homeless men, women and children. The organization eventually expanding to include support for the dire needs of alcoholic and addicted men and women who existed on the fringes of society.


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For more than 150 years, Olive Branch Mission has served the most vulnerable among us and employs the same empathetic and welcoming hospitality of its founding ideals —no one is turned away.

In a rapidly re-emerging city, Olive Branch Mission was addressing the spiritual and physical needs of a very poor and homeless population. The Mission applied an aggressive outreach emphasis toward developing intentional relationships with those who were broken, cast aside and rejected by society. Olive Branch Mission has consistently resisted an approach of condescending compassion as it has cared for individuals and families in need. Rather, it has always tried to affirm the dignity and value of each and every person, no matter their condition or immediate circumstances.

Wars, economic depression and civil unrest came and went, as did social, political and theological theories about poverty's causes and cures. Through it all, Olive Branch Mission has endured and to this day remains steadfast, carrying on an unwavering commitment to those who have lost their way. In the streets, in the alleys, under isolated bridges and in abandoned buildings is a wealth of lost human potential and resources. Olive Branch Mission declares that it can be reclaimed and restored. In fact, for the very sake of humanity – it must. In caring for and helping someone who has lost their way, we indeed are caring for a part of ourselves.





Journey to a Better Life

Olive Branch Mission is tackling the urgent need to provide a safe haven for people experiencing homelessness in Chicago. We meet people when they are at their most vulnerable –without shelter, without adequate resources, without immediate direction, and often times, without hope.

We focus our efforts on building people, and employ a 360° wrap-around approach to servicing clients. From the time a person is welcomed into our space, their most immediate needs are addressed and we prioritize providing the resources, support, and compassionate direction to assist in their journey to a better life.

Our strong and collaborative partnerships with the City of Chicago, and various social service agencies allow case managers to quickly assess a person's needs and work with them to determine the most appropriate path combating the issues that led to homelessness.

A Crisis in Our Community

Thousands of Chicagoans lack stable, permanent housing. Tens of thousands more are just one unexpected expense away from the same fate. Nearly a fourth of Chicagoans live below the poverty level.

Homelessness is a community crisis that requires a community response. This

economic problem in Chicago and cities around the world is exacerbated by a severe shortage of affordable housing and chronically low wages for many individuals. The high cost of living often forces people to choose between food, health care, and other expenses, forcing them out of their homes and without stablehousing.

Olive Branch Mission believes it our responsibility to do all we can to support our city's most vulnerable and desperate. We exist so people know someone cares.

We're on the <u>Front Lines</u> of the fight against homelessness. The cause of this crisis is multi-faceted and we address them from every angle.

Cause: Lack of Affordable Housing

In light of our city's severe lack of affordable housing, Olive Branch Mission addresses clients' most critical and pressing need – safe, clean, and warm shelter to more than 1,500 people each year, including 550 children. This totals more than 150,000 nights of shelter for individuals in need.

Cause: Lack of Employable Skill / Education

One of the most necessary services we provide individuals at Olive Branch Mission is referrals for educational support. Some clients enroll in onsite tutoring and GED preparation classes, while others are connected to an employment staffing network. We connect nearly 400 clients to educational programs and connect over 1,700 clients to job training programs,annually.

Cause: Physical and Mental Health Challenges

Approximately 26% of the homeless population lives with severe mental illness, according to the U.S. Conference of Mayors. In 2018, Olive Branch Mission referred over 750 clients for mental and physical health services – providing the guidance to receive direct support and resources to address health challenges.

Cause: Lack of Resources and Direction

Some clients lack the know-how and basic resources to navigate life. At Olive Branch Mission, we assist in providing clients the tools to navigate life. This includes allocating thousands of bus passes annually to ensure safe, reliable transportation. We provide advocacy to secure mainstream benefits as well as vital records and documents.



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Olive Branch Mission is not in the business of simply giving handouts, glorifying, managing or maintaining human tragedy and poverty, but rather, this great Mission stands firm against enhancing dependency.

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Key Areas of Investment

The need is great. Until homelessness is eradicated, there will be people who depend on the support and resources of Olive Branch Mission to help them navigate a better tomorrow for themselves and their families. The work we do at Olive Branch Mission has a ripple effect in our communities, and in our city. Our key areas of financial needs include:

HOUSING

When an individual enters the doors at Olive Branch Mission, they have reached the end of their personal resources for housing. While a job loss, a mental or health crisis, or some other factor may have been the reason for their situation, the result is the same – they are vulnerable, lack resources, and are searching for help. For more than 150 years, Olive Branch Mission has been the helping hand that individuals and families have depended on to meet their immediate need for housing. Providing shelter for thousands of vulnerable individuals is a multi-faceted responsibility. We work hard to ensure that our clients feel welcome, safe, and valued. Maintaining this standard with security, utilities, and other expenses requires considerable financial resources.

MEALS

Thanks to the incredible generosity of our food partners – The Greater Chicago Food Depository, Starbucks, Inc., and the community-based Whole Foods. Olive Branch Mission provides more than 350,000 meals for individuals each year. Still, the organization dedicates a significant portion of its budget to ensuringweprovideforthismostbasichumanneed.

PROGRAMS

While immediate shelter and addressing hunger is often the foremost urgent need, Olive Branch Mission is in the business of ensuring individuals identify the unique challenges that may be the root cause of their inability to secure housing and live independently. All potential clients work with program directors and case managers to address the underlying causes and work to design and enact specialized individual service plans to mitigate them.

CAPITAL AND STRUCTURAL

Olive Branch Mission's main structure is over 110 years old. The 60,000 square foot structure requires significant maintenance and consistent repairs. The electrical and plumbing systems are antiquated, and any emergency, like the pipe burst we experienced in February 2019, poses a significant financial challenge to operations. Donors were generous then and we can only hope that the same will be said for any future emergencies. However, good stewardship requires that the organization be prepared and financially strong so that one emergency doesn't threaten our entire operational system. Olive Branch Mission also requires food storage spaces that are efficient. Our current storage area requires improvement and modernizing.

FINANCIAL NEED

Olive Branch Mission must secure

\$2.8M in public and philanthropic dollars to carry out its mission this year.



At Olive Branch Mission, we house more than

individuals experiencing homelessness each day –more than 1/3 of them are children.
